<b>COVID Transmission Level Per CDC (over a 1 week average) and/or building/community data</b>	<b>School Mitigation Response</b>
Low/ No cases identified in the community or at school	No mask recommendations
Moderate/cases in the community but not at school	Masks recommended for unvaccinated students, staff, and visitors
Substantial/positive cases in the school- will be on a per class basis	<p>Masks required for unvaccinated students staff, and visitors</p> <p>Masks recommended for vaccinated students, staff, and visitors</p> <p>Masks required in a classroom where a positive covid case has been identified.</p>
High/positive cases in multiple grades at school- will be on a grade range	<p>Masks required for ALL students, staff, and visitors regardless of vaccination status</p> <p>May be on a grade range dependent upon cases.</p>

\*Masks are currently mandated on all bussing

Key:

**Low** = Fewer than 5% positive test rate and fewer than 10 new cases/100,000 people

**Moderate**=5-7.99% positive test rate or 10-49 new cases/100,000 people

**Substantial**=8-9.99% positive test rate or 50-99 new cases/100,000 people

**High**=10+% positive or more than 100 new cases per 100,000 people
