About FAFSA

- MUST be completed in order to qualify for ANY federal or state financial aid (or loans)
- USE YOUR PERSONAL EMAIL ACCOUNT
- The student can complete most portions of the application, but a parent/guardian is required to electronically complete the FAFSA application
- Must be completed and submitted <u>every year</u> that the student will attend college

Initial Setup: FSA ID

- FIRST: Create your Federal Student Aid Identification (FSA ID) HERE.
- The student creates their own FSA ID (USING PERSONAL EMAIL ADDRESS)
- A parent/guardian will also need to create an FSA ID (using a different email address than the student)
- These FSA IDs serve as an electronic signature on FAFSA documents

Starting the FAFSA Form

- Log in to the FAFSA website HERE
 - Student logs in using their FSA ID
 - Complete 2 step verification via text or email
 - Accept the terms and conditions
- Start a New 2026-2027 FAFSA form


You must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form for each year of school in which you need financial aid. There is a deadline for your school, for your state, and for us.




Do unusual circumstances prevent the student from contacting their parents or would contacting their parents pose a risk to the student? ①

- have refugee or asylee status and are separated from their parents, or their parents are displaced in a foreign country;
- are a victim of human trafficking;
- are incarcerated, or their parents are incarcerated, and contact with the parents would pose a risk to the student; or
- $\bullet \ \ are \ otherwise \ unable \ to \ contact \ or \ locate \ their \ parents.$






SECTION 6: Signature

- STUDENTS: bring your Drivers License if you have one, or a State ID
- PARENTS: your 2024 taxes and students taxes, if they filed

ENTS: bring any records of any child support received

NTS & STUDENTS: you'll need to be able to open your email to be able to log

ENTS & STUDENTS: you will need to know your Social Security numbers

ENTS & STUDENTS: you will need to provide your date of birth

NTS & STUDENTS: you'll need to know your current balance of cash, savings, shecking accounts, and net worth of any investments, businesses, or farms
